Governor Braun Signs HEA 1391 at LifeSpan Resources

On July 1, Governor Mike Braun visited LifeSpan Resources to sign House Enrolled Act 1391 into law, which modernizes the CHOICE program for the aged and disabled. He was welcomed by State Representative Ed Clere, who authored the bill, along with sponsors and co-authors Senator Chris Garten, Senator Gregory Goode, State Representative Lori Goss-Reaves and State Representative Wendy Dant-Chesser. The governor signed the bill into law in front of a standing room only crowd filled with CHOICE program participants, FSSA officials, IAAAA Interim CEO Hannah Carlock and RJL Government Relations Manager Derion Searcey, and AAA representatives from all over the state of Indiana, including: Jennifer Malone, Chris Myers, Lisa Schneekloth, Erin Thomas, Jenny Hamilton, Laura Holscher, Kelly Walter and Ryan Keller. In addition, many LifeSpan Resources Board, Advisory Council and staff members attended. Thank you, State Representative Clere for your leadership on this important bill for our older adults and individuals with disabilities!








Dementia Friends Workshop
